Kessingland Parish Council Budget 2024-25

The Parish Council is required by law to prepare a budget to calculate its Precept requirement. The Precept is the tax that the Town Council's levy on their local electors to meet their budget requirements. The Precept forms part of your Council Tax which is collected via East Suffolk Council. Parish councils do not receive any direct funding from central government or from Business Rates and rely on their Precept plus any other income the council generates from services or facilities which it provides.

The budget must give details of planned expenditure for the financial year ensuring that financial resources are aligned to the priorities of the Council and is conscious that the money it receives comes from the people of Kessingland as Councillors pay council tax as well. The table below gives details of the budget overview.

The council's finances and policies and procedures are audited both by the council, by an employed accredited auditor and by a government appointed auditor each year and there is a month each year where the Annual Accounts for the whole year are open for public scrutiny.

On the days that have been dry, our volunteers have been hard at work clearing the raised beds of weeds and getting them ready for vegetable planting/sowing and plans are being drawn up as to what to plant and where. We'll be going through the "seed-swap" box to see if we can use any of those seeds which have been kindly donated. Judging by the number of packets in the box we will probably be spoilt for choice.

The liner for the new pond has arrived so we can now really concentrate on getting it completed. We are also looking forward to having a proper water supply connected which should be done within the next few weeks. This will help enormously with the upkeep of the Garden as over the last couple of years we've lost a lot of fruit and vegetable plants due to lack of water.

The Suffolk Walking Festival is back for 2024. Created in 2007 the festival is one of the largest and longest running walking festivals in the country with 57 walks to choose from.



The festival started life as the Heart of Suffolk Walking Festival with just 30 walks in the central part of they county. In 2010 it gained support across Suffolk to become the Suffolk Walking Festival. In 2012 a long-distance multi-day walk names "The Challenge Walk" was launched, and in 2018 a Fringe Festival, with activities that got you close to nature in the very heart of the countryside, was introduced.

Active Suffolk supports Kessingland to empower residents through Strength and Balance sessions

Within Kessingland, for the past seven weeks, Active Suffolk has been supporting the facilitation of a Fit Villages project offering Strength and Balance sessions to residents. The project which is designed to cater to the diverse needs of the village residents has already been a resounding success!

The sessions focus on exercises using equipment such as kettlebells, suspension trainers, medicine balls and other tools to allow them to engage in movement that improves muscle power, stability, and co-ordination. This kind of exercise promotes a huge number of benefits to participants'



health including the prevention of falls, reducing the risk of developing chronic health conditions such as diabetes and heart disease, and enhancing mood and promoting confidence.

Despite previous projects sometimes finding it more difficult to engage male participants in the sessions, this programme has seen an extremely commendable turnout with almost 40% of participants being male. This demographic distribution is particularly encouraging as we enter the final weeks of the project, with participants numbers for both female and male participants reaching 16, an all-time high!

Andrew Buckingham, one of the participants in the sessions said:

"[It's] great to have a fitness session in the village and tailored to the over 50's. It's helping me recover from [a] back injury. Not the generation to go to a gym, sessions in the village hall tailored to older folks' needs is spot-on. We have progressed from an easy intro and are now pushing on at our own, individual pace. I know there are others in the village it would help, too."

In even better news, while the project does still currently have two more weeks to run, it has already been so well received by the village that Reverend Mandy Bishop has secured the appropriate funding so that the sessions can continue to carry on at no cost to the community!

Reverend Mandy said:




