




## Mini Monsters visit the Nursery

## LKS2 Roman Immersive Day - 29.03.2023

On Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March, LKS2 took part in a Roman Immersive Day, which was set up and run by an external company called Make the Classroom Disappear. During this day, the children were able to take part in a variety of experiences and really develop their understanding of our History topic, The Romans.

The day began with everyone gathering in the hall to meet Terrance, a Roman who had come to visit to tell us about what Britain was like when the Romans invaded. We discussed what we would do if faced with the decision of whether to join the Roman army and the different viewpoints to consider. We then learnt about how houses were built, constructed a mosaic floor and even learnt how the Romans used to go to the toilet!

After this, the children were split into three groups and moved around a carousel of activities. This included using research information boards to find answers to quiz question; learning how to write Roman numerals on slates with slate pencils; playing a game where the Romans had to capture Boudica; and handling artefacts of domestic life including foods, rotary quern, spices, toys and making cosmetics. The children were thoroughly engaged throughout this section of the day and enjoyed the variety of activities available to them.

After lunch, everyone joined together again to learn about the Roman timeline and how this period fits in with other time periods that the children had learnt about. Following this, the children had a go at building arches from wooden blocks and were amazed when they could take away the internal arch and the outside arch still remained standing with no support! This linked to the next activity, which involved operating a replica Roman crane, and the children developed their understanding of how different and much harder it was to build large structures in Roman times. Finally, we ended the day with a gladiator contest, where the audience got to decide whether the defeated gladiator got to survive or be killed!

Throughout the whole day, the children enjoyed learning about how the Romans lived and were able to develop their understanding of what they had learnt about the topic earlier in the term. The feedback from the children and the staff who took part was extremely positive and it was definitely a day that the children will remember. We would all like to say a massive 'Thank You!' to the Parish Council for subsidising this opportunity. We had an amazing time.

## MAKE A CHANGE BECOME A COUNCILLOR

Could you be a voice for your community?

Do you think that you would represent a different group of people on the Parish Council?

Do you have strong views about what Kessingland Parish Council should be doing?

Do you know what the Parish Council can do?

Kessingland Parish Council are looking for three councillors to fill the vacancies on the parish council which were not filled in the May election.

If you're over eighteen years of age and live or work within Kessingland (or within three miles of the Kessingland boundary) and do not have any of the disqualifying criteria, then we would like to hear from you! Especially if you are different than the people already on the council. Kessingland is a diverse community and the council wants to recognise, celebrate and represent that diversity.

The key qualities for a councillor are to keep an open mind and to listen to, learn about, care for and represent your community to the best of your ability.

Applying is easy, there is a short form which you can collect from the parish council or download online. Just complete and either email or drop it off at the council. You'll be invited to attend a Parish Council meeting (generally the second Wednesday each month) and tell the council more about yourself, what you can bring to the council and what you would like to achieve for the community. There may be more candidates than spaces, so be really positive about yourself as the council will only be able to choose three people to co-opt.

The deadline for applications to be received & considered is 5pm Wednesday 7th June 2023
