

We won an incredible total of four awards:



Timings for the school day:

Universal Hygiene

We have been encouraging our pupils to continue with the excellent hygiene habits they have developed and we hope you continue to encourage your child/ren to do the same at home:



- Washing hands thoroughly with soap and water often.
- Using hand sanitiser.
- Washing hands on arrival to school, before eating, after coughing or sneezing, and after visiting the toilet.
- Reminding pupils to wash and sanitise hands when they get home at the end of the school day, as well as at other regular intervals throughout the day.



Kessingland Men's Shed



Men's Shed Update for November 2025

The Kessingland Men's Shed have successfully applied for a grant of £9569.64 from the Sizewell C Community Fund.

This grant will allow the Kessingland Men's Shed to bring in a licenced contractor to remove all the internal panelling up to the eaves, as it contains low grade asbestos. They will then fill the void with insulation before relining with ply and re-decorating.

In its present state, the panelling is not being disturbed so it poses no risk but, other than the bits we can attach to the existing wooden battens, we are restricted to having free-standing furniture, benches and shelving.

This renovation work (along with the insulation that came with the new roof) will make the Shed more energy efficient; nearly as green inside as it is outside. The removal of the potentially harmful asbestos will also allow us to keep the environment within the existing building warmer and healthier with the asbestos removed. The building still retains asbestos in the ceiling lining but with this not being disturbed we only need to have this tested annually.

This grant shows the professionalism of the members who have collectively put together successful grant applications for a new roof, new windows, dust extractors, pillar drill, and now relining, at total of some £30,000 in the last 18 months.

The Kessingland Parish Council and our ESC and SCC Councillors have supported our applications and continue to show their support for the Kessingland Men's Shed, for which we are so grateful.

These grants allow us to support the members and help out other village groups where we can.

The provision of a fully insulated building means we can support our members and visitors with warmth and friendship in a healthy working environment.

We are pleased to open our doors to members and visitors to offering a tea or coffee a chat and a yarn. We are open from 9-1pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays.

We are still welcoming new members, so pop down to the Shed, on Bethel Drive, for a coffee and a chat, where you can fill in a form if you want to join up or contact the Secretary on 07950 837083. Opening times are 9-1pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays.
