From The Rectory, Revd Mandy writes: September 2023

For many of us, we will be returning to clubs, village committees and groups that have perhaps had a break for the Summer holidays. Perhaps we have children or grandchildren that we have spent extra time with during this time and now are preparing for them to start another school year. Perhaps we are students returning to adult education. For most of us then, September may be a time of anxiousness because we know that it is a new term or season, and that means reviewing what we did in the past and preparing for the future.

The village I grew up in was two miles away from the Church and Primary school I attended. There was transport, but only in the irregularity of buses, so in the daylight months, this meant getting up very early in the morning to walk with the few who lived around me. Along the way we often sang songs that we had learnt in school, it was pleasant. Later in life I would progress to secondary school, as my elder sister did. The journey for her to that secondary school was so much further, and I can remember she was concerned about moving up-to a school where there would be new curriculum, new groups and more challenges. To ease the time spent walking, our local vicar had loaned her a bicycle, so that in the daylight months she could enjoy the countryside, although reducing walking time, still the thought of this challenge to cycle so far was a bit daunting to her at first.

But you see the cycling was not about getting to school quicker, or just an easier mode of transport to rely upon, it was all about embracing the joy of cycling, the progress she made each day by getting up that hill at the end of the road easier, and the perseverance she needed to stick at it when her legs got tired or her basket was heavier than normal with extra books. It was about believing in herself and taking on challenges.

Jesus was always on the move. He sometimes took a break to recharge, knowing he would have to start again in a new place with a new agenda and set new directives. To do this, Jesus gathered friends to share his journeys with him. He encouraged them on their way, and he promised to be with them till the end of time. And so it can be for us.

When we face a new beginning or new task, we can call on those around us, to join us, to help us, to share their ideas and expertise. Jesus sent his disciples out in pairs, do you have some-one you can invite to share your tasks with? Or can you assist someone whose starting out on a new role within the village or church?

The Vicar gave my sister a bicycle, to this end, he was sharing his support with her, in developing within her the self-worth she would need for the next phase of her life, positivity to overcome challenges and confidence in her own ability. The bicycle was not a means to get to wherever she was going quicker, it was a tool to develop her stamina and self-worth of achieving, over the next few years.

Starting something new, can be scary but it develops us all. Sharing something new, can feel a bit awkward, but it encourages us all.

Perhaps this September you might mark a new season with a mindset to share with each other, as Jesus disciples did to the world and God shares His loves for each of us with each one of us.

BACT Community Transport



Bact community transport seeking weekend volunteer drivers for growing transport demand

Bact community transport are receiving a growing number of requests for transport at the weekends. The organisation provides transport for people who cannot easily access public transport, whether that be due to a lack of provision or for accessible reasons.

Many of these requests are for medical and hospital appointments to local medical centres and both James Paget and Norfolk & Norwich University hospitals. Volunteer drivers are also needed to transport passengers to their surgeries/pharmacies for covid vaccinations and blood tests. Do you have spare time in your day to take someone to attend such appointments? Not all journeys are for medical purposes.

Maybe you could find time to take someone to visit their loved one in a nearby nursing home or hospice? Bact community transport also have young people who are keen to attend groups and sports clubs and partake in activities such as football and rugby training. Volunteer drivers are often extremely busy throughout the week. With the growing number of weekend requests, it is proving challenging to fulfil the demand with the current resources.

Manager, Debbie Blowers said..."We are mindful of people being forced to cancel and postpone vital appointments due to a lack of transport. We have wonderful volunteers who volunteer a lot during the week, so we can't expect them to give up more of their time at weekends. Just doing one transport run in a weekend can help us enormously without intruding too much on a person's weekend."

Bact volunteer drivers all receive training and receive a mileage allowance. They require an enhanced DBS certification which is managed through bact. Drivers can opt to use their own vehicles or those belonging to bact.

New volunteer driver, Mike Orves said..."My time with bact has really given me a great deal of satisfaction. One of my first passengers was a lady who I took to the hairdressers. When I picked her up, she looked so happy to see me and to show me her new hairdo. The smile on her face will stay with me for a long while. It gave me a real sense of satisfaction that I had played a part in making that person so happy."

Richard Bassett, volunteer driver added..."I have enjoyed the whole experience. From walking in to the bact office followed by basic formalities and liaising with amazing office staff to starting to drive a few months ago. Not once have I regretted my decision. I recognise every aspect is as good as can be from advising bact of the hours I am available for on a weekly basis to the kindly consideration and organisation of the office

staff. Above all, I am enjoying the getting about and stimulation of company I wouldn't have otherwise met. Passengers, who are not strangers for long, often remark on how very, very useful community transport is. So, I never regret a moment, quite the opposite!"

Community Wildlife Garden



Another busy month has flown by, where does the time go!! Our lovely volunteers are hard at work as always and this month has seen a major cut of all the grass, the mound behind the storytelling chair will be cut in the next few weeks. Apart from the pathways, the grass shouldn't need cutting until the Spring but it may get one more cut in the Autumn. All the raised beds have been cleared and topped up with new compost/soil and are ready for winter veg planting and the remaining flower beds are gradually being weeded and tidied ready for planting of some spring bulbs.

With the harvest, the carrots, tomatoes and apples are ready to pick, unfortunately the cabbages got completely demolished by caterpillars despite being covered in netting. a bit of a disaster but we'll just be a bit more cautious next time. The pond plants have really taken well & hiding in amongst them is a new "lodger", a little frog has made the pond his home which is great news, hopefully more will follow his lead & move in too.

Please remember that anything that is grown & harvested in the garden is for the Community so please do help yourself to anything that is ready. Any surplus will be given to the Community Fridge based in the library.

Our volunteers will be on site from 9am every Tuesday morning (weather permitting of course) so come along and see for yourself the progress being made in your Community Garden. If you have some spare time on your hands, come along and join the Volunteer Group, everybody is welcome. Dogs are also welcome into the Garden, but please remember to keep them on leads & clear up after them. Also, don't forget our Seed Swap box is available for donations of unwanted/surplus seeds, please do make good use of it.

This summer, such as it has been, the guys at the Kessingland Men's Shed have focused on repairs to the building. The windows delivered by Dream Installations were installed by our members before being inspected to maintain the guarantees by Dream last year. This year it was about sealing the roof with the facia boards and guttering. We have completed on the East side and are in the process of the south facing gable end. We are hopeful that the west and north faces can be completed by November. Painting of the East and North has been completed and the building is looking quite presentable. The double doors on the East side should be installed before November. For security we have installed CCTV which provides good quality video to meet the standards required by Suffolk police.

Internally, we have a quiet room which is going to be the Gerald Brown Room and we are looking at a number of features in memory of Gerald. A big wall clock seems to be the favourite. We shall have a formal naming of the room where we will invite Sharon and Richard and their family and those who would like to attend would be welcomed.

The members continue to carry out repairs to broken items for other members and their friends and family as well as making suitable objects to raise funds. The Kessingland Men's Shed provides other groups in the village the offer to make or repair items that the groups require, and we look forward to increasing the number of groups we can support. In the true Gerald Brown tradition, we continue to open a bazaar for people to browse and if they like to take away books etc and leave a donation, equally we look forward to those of you in the village who have not been to visit to come along and have a chat and a coffee.
