The First Light Federation:

We believe that every child is a unique light, created by God to shine brightly in the world. We are united in our commitment to nurturing every child in a loving, inclusive, and spiritually rich environment.

Inspired by the Parable of the Good Shepherd, we care for each individual with compassion—guiding, protecting, and ensuring every learner feels seen, heard, and safe. Rooted in the teachings of Jesus, and especially His promise in John 10:10, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full," we strive to help every child aspire to be the very best they can be: academically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually.

Our community is built on the values of respect, trust, love, aspiration, and compassion, fostering relationships where everyone feels safe, empowered, and celebrated.

We look forward to this exciting new chapter as The First Light Federation of Church Schools.

Communication Guidance:



If you have a concern or issue relating to your child, please raise this with your child's class teacher in the first instance. Class teachers know the children best day to day and are usually able to resolve matters quickly. If you feel the matter needs to be taken further, please contact our Head of School, Miss Smith.

Should you require further discussion after this, the matter will be referred to Miss Egleton (Executive Headteacher). In exceptional circumstances, you may contact Miss Egleton directly by emailing office@kessingland.dneat.org or by calling 01502 740223 to arrange an appointment.

If your concern relates to a family matter, please make Mrs. Cooper, our Pastoral Lead, aware. Mrs. Cooper is available on the school gate every morning and afternoon (Monday-Thursday) and is always happy to help.

Thank you for working with us to ensure that concerns are addressed in the most effective way.

Timings for the school day:

The **gates open at 8.30am**. Parents and carers can walk their children to the classroom door where a member of the teaching team will be waiting to welcome them.

Gates will be locked promptly at 8:45am. If you arrive after this time, you will be asked to register your child at the main school office and provide a reason for their late arrival.



School collection is at 3:15pm. Parents and carers can collect their children from the classroom doors on the playground. We will open the gates at 3pm to avoid congestion.

Regular school attendance & parent's legal responsibilities:



At Kessingland Primary our aim is to collaborate with parents to ensure that all our pupils receive the most from their education and reach their full God-given potential.

This guidance is to remind all parents about the law that requires them to ensure that their child attends school regularly. The Government is clear that no child should miss school apart from in exceptional circumstances and schools must take steps to reduce absence to support children's attainment.

The important legal information

The Government have introduced a single national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England. This threshold is **10 sessions** (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The period of 10 school weeks can span different terms or school years.

In line with national guidance, the Local Authority (LA) retains the discretion to issue a penalty notice before the threshold is met. This might apply for example, where parents have taken several term time holidays below the national threshold. The LA also retains the discretion to consider going straight to prosecution where appropriate. A maximum of 2 penalty notices per parent, per child can be issued within a rolling 3-year period. This period will start from the issue of the 1st penalty notice.

Penalty notices will usually be issued to the parent/s with day-to-day responsibility for the child's attendance or the parent/s who have allowed the absence (regardless of which parent has applied for a leave of absence).

The first penalty notice issued to a parent for a child will be charged at £160 to be paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days. Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice, the second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child within 3



years of the first offence, is charged at a flat rate of £160 and is payable within 28 days. There is no reduced sum available in this instance. Part payments or payment plans are not acceptable, and fines must be paid in full within 21 or 28 days, at the rate specified within the penalty notice. There is no right of appeal against a penalty notice.

Requests for leave of absence

The Government advises all schools that they should only grant a leave of absence during term time in exceptional circumstances, considering each request on a case-by-case basis. If a leave of absence is granted, it is for the head teacher to determine the length of time the pupil can be away from school.

Although we recognise the value and benefits of family holidays, it is unlikely a leave of absence will be granted for a family holiday as the Government 'does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.'

Requests for leave must be made in advance, otherwise schools will be unable to consider your individual circumstances and the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Head teachers are not obligated to reconsider authorising leave if an application was not made in advance.

Support with ensuring regular school attendance

If you require any support with ensuring your child's attendance, please contact Mrs. Cooper, in the first instance. I hope we can count on your support in this matter.

A few reminders:



Please do let us know of any updates to contact information

- We provide a healthy snack for all pupils in Nursery, Reception and Key Stage 1. Pupils wishing to bring in a snack for playtime should keep this separate to their packed lunch and put it in their class drawer. Snacks should be healthy fruit/ veg/ oat bars. No sweets or chocolate should be brought into school.
- We are a **nut free school**. Please ensure packed lunches/ snacks do not contain nuts or nut products- this includes spreads such as Nutella and snack bars.

- Class teachers have shared PE days on their Dojo pages. Please send the children in to school ready for PE on these days. No jewellery should be worn at any time. If your child has pierced ears, please make sure earrings are removed for PE days.
- We ask that hair that is longer than shoulder length is tied back every day. This is for health and safety reasons but also to ensure we prevent the spread of head lice.
