Roadworks Disruption in Kessingland



To: All residents of Kessingland

From: Cllr Stephen (Sid) James, Chair of Kessingland Parish Council

Parishioners,

August has not been the best month for traffic management within Kessingland. Parishioners should be in no doubt the parish council had not sanctioned this work to take place, let alone in August. The population doubles in the summer months as we welcome tourists and visitors to the village. Consequently July and August are the worst months to commence work of this nature.

The parish council have no jurisdiction over utility companies such as City Fibre and Cadent. We received a general style email from Suffolk Highways saying essential works are a priority so they have 'licence' to do what they like when they like. The Government has insisted that full fibre is a priority and they want 85% of the country ready by the end of 2025 and the whole country by 2030. They don't even have to ask Suffolk County Council, they just inform them when and where.

We also have the same issue with Cadent (Gas) with gas main replacements taking place. Whilst this is essential work, we and Suffolk County Council were not informed, and when we queried it, we were directed to a national website of planned work to be carried out. This showed Field Lane and the High Street closed from 21st July to 23rd August.

I'm sure you agree this is not ideal but this is how it is. We have tried everything in our power to get answers but as the lowest tier of local government we unfortunately don't carry much clout. Notwithstanding that reproduced below is a copy of an email sent to our Suffolk County Councillor, Michael Ladd from District Councillor Alan Green on 25th July 2025. They represent Kessingland at Suffolk County Council and East Suffolk Council respectively. Cllr Green is also a Parish Councillor.

We can only apologise for the disruption but maybe a timely reminder with the unitary authority debate just around the corner!

Subject: Traffic chaos in Kessingland

Hi Michael,

As the ward member, I wish to lodge a formal complaint to SCC about the multiple roadworks in Kessingland if you would kindly pass to the relevant department, presumably whoever issues licences.

Due to the closure of Field Lane due to roadworks, the diversion signs sends traffic via Church Road, only to be confronted by three-way traffic lights at the junction of Church Road and Whites Lane. Border double decker buses are using Lloyds Ave where they encounter even further roadwork traffic lights. Lloyds Ave is also totally unsuitable for this type of traffic anyway. One Bus are running a shuttle bus from Wash Lane to Africa Alive to pick up the bus to Lowestoft, reversing into Fisherman's Way to turn round at one end and the entrance to Africa Alive at the other causing more chaos.

This is the first weekend of the holidays when Kessingland welcomes the first visitors of the season and it is disappointing and frankly quite madness to have all the roadworks allowed at same time. I lay no blame on the bus services, they are just trying to serve their customers as best they can amongst the chaos.

We meet every Monday evening from 7.30-10.30pm. (Except Bank Holidays). All welcome £5 entrance includes free tea, coffee & snacks.






